
SPORTS DAY

It was a great honour to be one of the oldest schools in the procession to mark 70 years of Welsh medium education in the Capital. Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Glantaf opened in September 1978 with one hundred pupils on roll. The first headteacher of the school was Mr J.E. Malcolm Thomas who was assisted by a team of ten teachers. Currently the school has over 1,300 pupils on the register and approximately sixty teachers. The turn out during Tafwyl Weekend was a real reflection of the success of Welsh medium education in the Capital; the city is now home to 17 Welsh medium primary schools and 3 Welsh medium secondary schools. It is a great privilege to be a part of the Welsh education revolution. Onwards and upwards we go!
